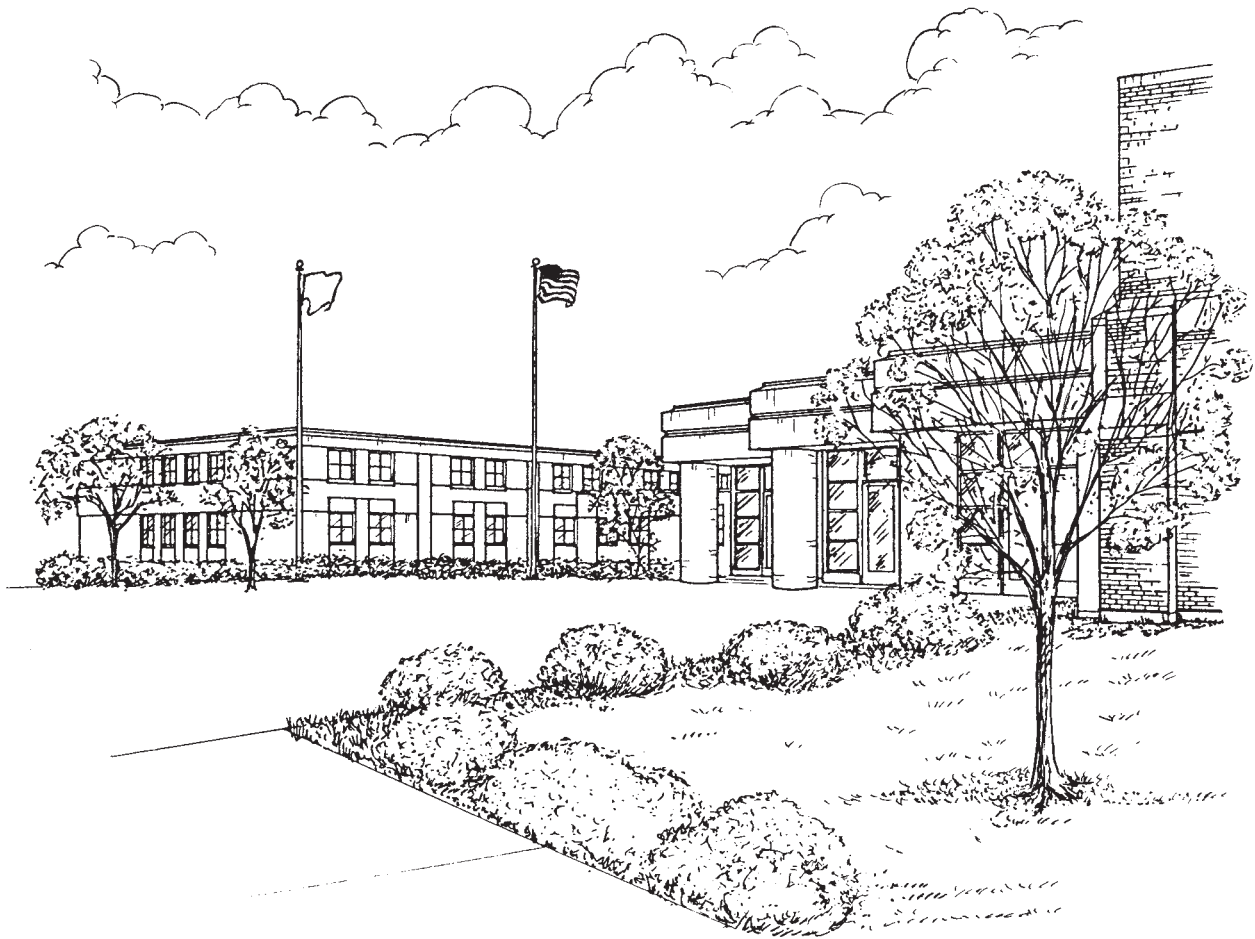

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About the Community

South Windsor is a suburban town in Hartford County consisting of a population of approximately 25,000. The South Windsor Public school system consists of five elementary schools (K-5), one middle school (6-8) and one high school (9-12).

About the Curriculum

South Windsor High School offers an extensive variety of programs and courses designed to challenge its diverse student population and maintain a high level of professional competence among faculty. Levels of study can vary to meet student needs and include Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (Level 4), and College Preparatory (Level 3). Also, students can enroll in cooperative programs with local colleges and universities, including Manchester Community College, Goodwin College and the University of Connecticut. Articulation programs are also available with area magnet schools and include the Greater Hartford Academy for the Arts and Bristol Technical Education Center. Another option for students is to take an Independent Study course under the supervision of a faculty instructor. English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are also offered in order to better assist non-English speaking students who are transitioning into South Windsor High School. All students are encouraged to maintain an individually rigorous program.

About the School

South Windsor High School serves approximately 1,320 students grades 9-12. It is dedicated to providing students a safe and supportive environment in which learning is an active, self-directed quest for knowledge. The school emphasizes intellectual curiosity, personal integrity, physical wellness and emotional maturity of students by providing classroom experiences and extracurricular activities. Through these activities students engage in lifelong learning.

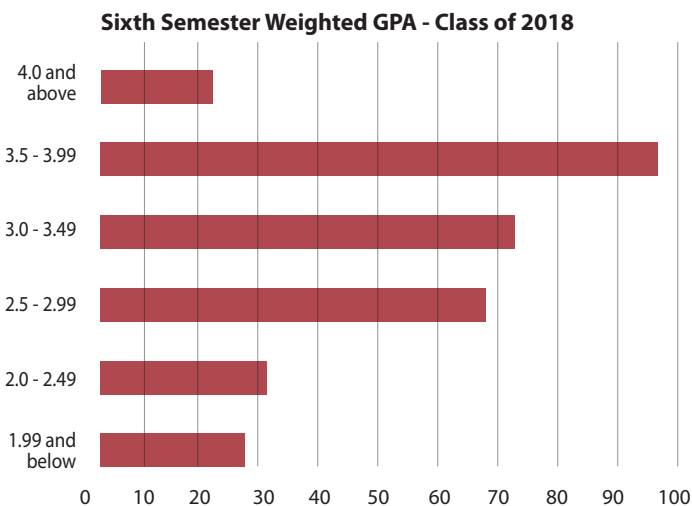
