
### Scattergrams | Applications for South Windsor High School



#### When will the Connecticut SAT School Day be administered to grade 11 students?

The three-hour Connecticut SAT School Day will be administered during the school day to all grade 11 public school students on March 24 or April 13, 2021. Make-ups will be administered on April 27 and/or 28, 2021. There will be no cost to districts for administration of the Connecticut SAT School Day on these dates. Both the Connecticut State Department of Education and each LEA are legally responsible to administer these assessments to all students.

#### What does the Connecticut SAT School Day measure?

The Connecticut SAT School Day has two sections: evidence-based reading and writing and mathematics. The evidence-based reading and writing section includes a reading test and a writing and language test. An independent content alignment study confirmed that in both English language arts and mathematics, the majority of the Connecticut Core Standards have a strong or moderate match to the Connecticut SAT School Day. The optional essay is not offered on the Connecticut SAT School Day.

#### What is assessed on the Connecticut SAT School Day?

The Connecticut SAT School Day focuses on the skills and knowledge that evidence shows are needed most for college and career success. It reflects what students are already learning in their classrooms in mathematics and ELA with literacy focused on topics from science, history, and social studies. The vocabulary portion of the Connecticut SAT School Day will focus on words that students use consistently in college and beyond. #### Can students use calculators on the Connecticut SAT School Day?

A calculator will be allowed on one of two sections in the Connecticut SAT School Day Math Test. Please read the College Board's calculator policy for specific information on which calculators can be used on test day.

#### What will be the score ranges for the SAT?

The Connecticut SAT School Day will be scored on a 400- to 1600-point scale. The evidence-based reading and writing section and the mathematics section will each be scored on a 200- to 800-point scale. There is no penalty for wrong answers.

#### Do colleges and universities require an essay?

The College Board has a list of colleges and universities that have established positions on whether they will require the SAT optional essay for admissions.

# Guaranteed Admission Program

This program is designed for transfer students who enroll in a Liberal Arts transfer program at one of Connecticut's Community Colleges. Students who plan to continue their studies to earn a bachelor's degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences, Agriculture and Natural Resources or Business are guaranteed admission to the University of Connecticut once the associate degree has been earned, appropriate courses have been completed, and minimum grades and requirements for the selected program have been achieved

# Admissions Requirements & Timeline

### 0-30 CREDITS:

- Meet with an advisor at your community college to determine your academic goals.
- · Learn about transfer options at UConn.
- · Apply for the Guaranteed Admission Program (GAP), if qualified.
- · Include your official high school transcript with your GAP Application
- · Receive admission letter to GAP.
- · Check UConn transfer equivalencies
- Meet every semester with an advisor at your community college for academic planning.
- · Attend UConn's Open House for Prospective Students

### 30-60 CREDITS:

- · See advisor for Pre-Graduation Audit.
- · Apply for graduation.
- · Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA due by February 15).
- · Send Intent to Enroll form to UConn (available from your community college advisor).
- · Apply by April 1 for fall enrollment.
- · Apply by October 1 for spring enrollment
- · Attend the Admitted Student Open House in the spring.
- Receive formal admission letter from UConn.
- Attend Transfer Orientation advising and register for classes at UConn.
- · Send an official final transcript to UConn.
